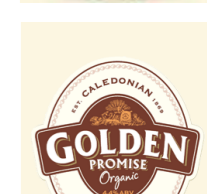

Glenkinchie is one of the few remaining Lowland distilleries, known "The Edinburgh Malt". Founded in 1825. Distillation in some of Scotland's largest stills; matured for 12 years, the result is a light, floral whisky with a fresh, creamy taste. "The Singleton of Dufftoen Speyside Malt since 1896 with water so pure, legend has it rival distillers have even tried to divert its course. The new-make spirit that runs from the three pairs of stills is best described as spicy in character. 12 years in a American and European Oak casks soften the spirit to deliver sweet fruity notes with a charming warmth and perfect balance. Talisker is produced by the only distillery on the Isle of Skye 1830. Known for its unique spicy flavour with an above average peat content (while not as peaty as an Islay malt). The "spicy" character (also described as "fiery" or "salty") comes from the water, malted barley, distilling method, barrels, and aging process. Dalwhinnie Highland distillery is one of the highest distilleries in Scotland, the clean, heather-honey flavours reflect its Highland mountain environment. Its name derives from the Gaelic for a 'meeting place' of sheep and cattle drovers. Its unique combination of a clean, accessible, malty-sweet taste leading in to a smooth and smoky Highland warmth. The style is that of the Highlands; a resilient marriage of gentleness and spirit.
